

This table discloses a tendency toward a reduction of the working time, but 11.7 per cent of the employees having worked less than 10 hours in 1902, while in 1907 the percentage had increased to 21.7, while the number of persons working more than 10 hours, excluding those whose hours are not reported, was 23.5 per cent of the total in 1902 as against but 13.9 in 1907. A few cities have a shorter workday in the winter, and a small number have three schedules, one for summer, one for winter, and one for spring and autumn. The hours between beginning and ending labor embrace in the majority of cases periods for meals or other pauses aggregating 2 hours during the day. Where continuous...
