It had adopted a constitution, and under the provisions of that fundamental law the first regular session of the union convened at Stoneall's Hotel, 131 Fulton Street, on Saturday evening, January 19, 1850. The important business of that meeting was the election of officers for the succeeding yearly term. Horace Greeley had been invited to accept the Presidency of the young organization, and he had cheerfully consented to serve in that capacity. He was therefore chosen unanimously, as were also these other officers: Vice-President, Edgar H. Rogers; Recording Secretary, William H. Prindle; Financial Secretary, R. Cunnington; Corresponding Secretary, George Johnson; Treasurer, Thomas N. Rooker. It was quite natural for the organized printers to select Horace Greeley as their first presiding officer, because...
